## BETTING RULES

### NEW SUPERFECTA BETTING RULES

1. A SUPERFECTA bet requires the selection of the four (4) betting interests to finish first, second, third and fourth, in the correct sequence, in a race nominated by the Promoter for the conduct of a SUPERFECTA pool.
2. The SUPERFECTA pool shall be operated with five (5) or more betting interests declared to start. If due to a late scratch, prior to the horses entered for a SUPERFECTA race taking the track, the number of betting interests in the SUPERFECTA race is reduced to four (4) or less, the total of all bets in the SUPERFECTA pool will be refunded.
3. The SUPERFECTA pool shall be calculated as follows:-
  - A) SUPERFECTA - (NO SINGLE WINNER) - (MORE THAN ONE WINNING TICKET WITH CORRECT SUPERFECTA WINNING COMBINATION). Gross Pool, less Government Tax and Club Fund equals Net Pool. Net Pool to be paid as follows - 80% to pay winners - 20% to the Single Winner Bonus.
  - B) SUPERFECTA - (SINGLE WINNER) - Gross Pool, less Government Tax and Club Fund equals Net Pool. Net Pool to be paid as follows - Once there is a single winning ticket then the entire Net Pool plus the Single Winner Bonus to be paid to the winner.
  - C) SUPERFECTA - (NO WINNERS) - Gross Pool, less Government Tax and Club Fund equals Net Pool. Net Pool to be distributed as follows – If there are no winners then the entire Net Pool becomes a Carryover.
4. In the event of a dead heat for first involving:-
  - A) Four or more betting interests, by dividing the Net Pool equally into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers, selecting the betting interests involved in the dead heat, irrespective of order, and sub-dividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers, or if
  - B) Horses representing three betting interests, by dividing the Net Pool equally into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the three betting interest involved in the dead-heat, irrespective of order, along with fourth placed betting interest correctly, and sub-dividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers, or if
  - C) Horses representing two betting interests, by dividing the Net Pool equally into as many parts as there are wining combinations on which there are wagers, selecting the two betting interest involved in the dead-heat, irrespective of order, along with the third and fourth placed betting interests correctly, and sub-dividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers.





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5. If there is a dead heat for second involving:-

- A) Horses representing three or more betting interest, by dividing the Net Pool into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the winner, together with any of the three or more betting interests involved in the dead heat for second, irrespective of order, and sub-dividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers, or if
- B) Horses representing two betting interests, by dividing the Net Pool equally into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the winner, together with any of the two betting interests involved in the dead-heat for second, irrespective of order, and the fourth placed betting interest correctly, and subdividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers.

6. If there is a dead heat for third involving:-

- A) Horses representing three or more betting interest, by dividing the Net Pool into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the winner and second placed betting interest together with any of the three betting interests involved in the dead heat for third, irrespective of order, and sub-dividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers, or if
- B) Horses representing two betting interests, by dividing the Net Pool equally into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the winner and second placed betting interest together with the two betting interests involved in the dead-heat for third, irrespective of order, and subdividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers.

7. If there is a dead-heat for fourth involving:-

- A) Horses representing three or more betting interest, by dividing the Net Pool into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the winner and the second and third placed betting interests, together with any of the three betting interests involved in the dead heat for fourth, irrespective of order, and sub-dividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers, or if
- B) Horses representing two betting interests, by dividing the Net Pool equally into as many parts as there are winning combinations on which there are wagers selecting the winner and the second and third placed betting interests, together with the two betting interests involved in the dead-heat for fourth, irrespective of order, and subdividing each part by the value of the bets on the combination to which it refers.

8. Where less than four (4) betting interests finish in a race to which the Superfecta bet relates and there are therefore no winning Superfecta bets in such race, the Net Superfecta Pool shall be divided as set
